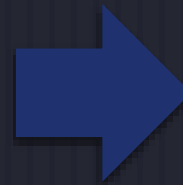

Advanced Welsh Baccalaureate

- Made up of 4 “Challenges”
 - 1. Community Challenge – 15%
 - 2. Enterprise and Employability – 20%
 - 3. Global Challenge – 15%
 - Individual Project – 50%
- If deadlines are kept to, students can complete this by Christmas of Year 13.

Grade	Llanishen High School	National Average
A*/A	30 %	15.6
A*-B	60 %	40.3 %
A*-C	80%	66.5 %
A*-E	100 %	94 %

- 49% of students achieved a better grade in their Welsh Baccalaureate than they did in their other 2-3 A-Levels
- 30% achieved in line with their other A-Level subjects

Data Continued

- 76% of students who studied 3-A Levels and the Welsh Bac used the Welsh Bac to form their top 3 grades.
- Only 1 student achieved lower in the Welsh Baccalaureate than her other A-Level grades.
- Students who formed the Honours groups – 40% of students used the Welsh Baccalaureate to form their top 3 results.

Added Value

- Individual Project discussed during University interviews and can be used in the personal statement.
- Community Hours allows for experience to be gained.
- Some Universities award bursaries for work carried out e.g. Morgan Stafford was awarded a bursary from for her Individual Project.

Destinations 2017

- 128 Students
- 94 UCAS Applications sent
- 88 Students placed (94%) – of these students some withdrew and are taking a gap year prior to starting university this year
- 31% Russell Group
- 3 Network 75 Applications (100% success rate)
- 37 – employment or other apprenticeship schemes
- Oxbridge – Applicants gained interviews
- Places gained in Medicine, Dentistry, Veterinary Sciences, Optometry
